MT LINDESAY BELLBIRD OPEN 2026 Small Bore & Field Pistol
Conditions of Entry:

- The competition will be held over three days under Pistol Australia (IMSSU) Rules. Competitors wishing to shoot all matches or sharing pistols **MUST** be prepared to shoot on all three days.
- All competitors, visitors and volunteers will comply with any health requirements in force at the time.
No shooting mats will be supplied, please bring your own mat.
- Gun checks will be supervised by the Jury and will commence on Practice day, Thursday 26 March 2026 if personnel are available, and on Friday, Saturday and Sunday one hour prior to the commencement of shooting.
Pistol Licenses/high calibre permits and Club membership will be checked
All competitors must be financial members of NSWAPA or a Target Pistol Australia affiliate and carry a current membership card.
- Shooters or their spotters will be required to reset and repaint targets.
It is recommended that gloves be worn when setting targets. Qualified or suitably experienced persons will be required to do Range Duties where indicated on their squadding form.
- All competitors should be graded and grading cards will be collected at gun check. Ungraded competitors will be graded on the score shot on the day.
- Shooting will commence at 8.00am each day unless shown otherwise on the squadding form. The shoot will be run on the relay system, no times will be given. Shooters should be ready at least one relay prior to their squadded relay.
- In the event of scores being tied, placings will be determined in the following manner:
 - First place and Top Gun awards must be decided by a shoot off if scores are equal.
 - Match aggregates will be decided by reverse animal count i.e. total number of rams, then turkeys etc. If score is still equal then tie will be broken by shoot off.
 - Ties for first, second and third place in grades will be decided by reverse animal count, and if still equal, tie will be broken by shoot off.
 - Shoot off sequence will be Standing, Field Pistol, Revolver, Production, Unlimited. Where a competitor is involved in more than one shoot off in the same category, the first score will count for both shoot offs.
 - Shoot off targets will be published prior to the commencement of the Match.
 - Shoot off will be 5 shots and will be exhaustive.
- The range will be available for practice until 3.00pm Thursday 26 March 2026
- All participants are to use the eastern exit from the shooting shelter to the range target lines and not the slope forward of the shooting line.

Canteen:

NO canteen for the shoot. Please BYO lunch, drinks etc

Camping:

Camping facilities (hot showers etc) are available at the range and campers may use Club facilities e.g. BBQ
